For the cohort in year 7, 44% or 19 students will achieve in the higher bands in numeracy.</p> <p>2020: For the cohort entering year 5 in 2020, 38% or 18 students will achieve in the higher bands in numeracy. For the cohort in year 7, 43% or 22 students will achieve in the higher bands in numeracy.</p> <p>2021: For the cohort entering year 5 in 2021, 39% or 16 students will achieve in the higher bands in numeracy. For the cohort in year 7, 46% or 19 students will achieve in the higher bands in numeracy.</p>	If teachers explicitly teach problem solving through transformed tasks and develop students capacity to reflect on their learning we will increase higher band achievement in mathematics.

For the cohort in year 7, 49% or 21 students will achieve in the higher bands in reading.</p> <p>2020: For the cohort entering year 5 in 2020, 46% or 22 students will achieve in the higher bands in reading. For the cohort in year 7, 41% or 21 students will achieve in the higher bands in reading.</p> <p>2021: For the cohort entering year 5 in 2021, 50% or 19 students will achieve in the higher bands in reading. For the cohort in year 7, 51% or 21 students will achieve in the higher bands in reading.</p>	If we explicitly provide opportunities for students to be exposed to and unpack quality literature in a range of genres, that include technical vocabulary, varied sentence structures and inferential comprehension, through both guided and independent reading we will improve our achievement in the higher bands.
