Review

They will be observing classes and meeting with teachers, students, parents and leadership staff. The review will be very useful as it will reaffirm our good practices and processes and provide us with information that will help us to further develop and further improve our practice.

Courtyard Play

The courtyard area is becoming a very popular play space. Children playing in this area are able to access board games, chess, drawing equipment, participate in any quiet activity from the cupboard. It is a great play area particularly for children not feeling comfortable in the yard as it ensures they have something to do during recess and lunch.

If your child is experiencing difficulties in the yard please speak to their classroom teacher or contact me so we can work with them, to make sure they are enjoying school.

Attendance

As outlined in our attendance policy, we believe that learning lost due to absenteeism or lateness can never be adequately replaced. 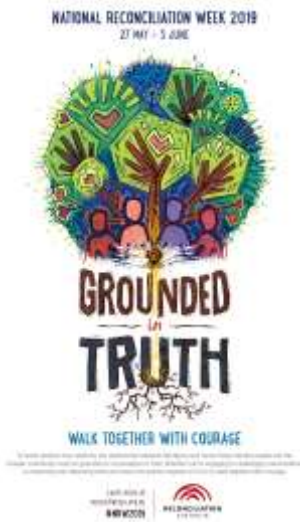

RECONCILIATION WEEK 2019

This week is National Reconciliation Week (NRW). The 2019 theme for NRW is 'Grounded in Truth – Walk Together with Courage'. This theme emphasizes the importance of 'truth-telling' about Australia's colonial history, and is symbolized through the stunning image of the 'Tree of Truth'.

At NAPS the 'Tree of Truth' is on display everywhere. In the art room students have been 'unpacking' the tree's symbolism and designing their own reconciliation imagery. In the library students are engaging with indigenous themed art and literature. In classrooms, teachers and students are sharing important conversations.

NAPS is committed to the process of reconciliation, and to ensuring our students gain a rich appreciation and understanding of ATSI history and culture. NAPS Governing Council has recently endorsed our first *Reconciliation Action Plan (RAP)*. The RAP provides a roadmap and foundation for future reconciliation action at NAPS.
