

#### Safety

Child safety is very important to us, please make sure you are travelling very slowly when near our school particularly near our school crossing on Gover St. We are becoming increasingly concerned about drivers travelling too fast or becoming distracted whilst trying to park. Children

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utilising the crossing are still developing their road safety skills and therefore it is really important that all drivers are very cautious when travelling near the school grounds.

#### **Writing Assessments**

One of the main goals on our Site Improvement Plan is to improve student achievement in writing, particularly in relation to higher band achievement. During the next few weeks teachers will be working together to moderate a sample of both persuasive and narrative texts from every student utilising the Brightpath program.

In term 1, teachers moderated both a narrative and a persuasive text and we are looking forward to comparing the samples to see growth made. These samples are analysed to determine students' individual teaching points and to set writing goals.
