#### Student Reports



Mid-Year progress reports will be going home at the end of week 10. They will be emailed to the email addresses we have registered for each parent. All students from Years 1 to 6 will receive an A to E graded report. The reports will cover student learning undertaken in Terms 1 and 2. Reception students will receive a different format of report which is not graded.

Teachers have been very busy writing these reports. Reports may include a Non-Submitted (NS) or Non-Applicable (NA) grade. Non-Submitted means that students have not completed their work. Not Applicable means that there is not enough evidence in this area for students to receive a grade in their mid-year report and so their final grade in this subject will be in their end of year report. Please remember that a 'C' grade is the expected achievement at your child's year level. Your child will also be given a grade for their effort and this is important to discuss with children as it will indicate whether you child is doing the best they can do. Your child's report might also include information regarding how your child is performing in the different areas of English and Maths. They will be marked as achieving below year level, at year level, or above year level.

#### Enrolments for 2024 – Semester 1 & 2

If you have a child due to commence school at NAPS in 2024 please contact Kathy in the Front Office to confirm the process to obtain a Registration of Interest form.

Registrations are now open for students who turn 5 prior to the 1<sup>st</sup> of May 2024 for Semester 1, and students turning 5 between the 1<sup>st</sup> of May and the 31<sup>st</sup> of October 2024 for Semester 2. Priority consideration will be given to applications from parents of prospective Reception students if they have been living inside the school zone



prior to Week 3 of Term 3 and whose application has been received by Friday 4th of August 2023.

#### M&S School Fees - IMPORTANT

Some families have not yet paid their school fees nor entered into a payment agreement. Therefore, your fees are now overdue. In the near future another statement will be posted out to families yet to pay, to avoid Debt Collection, please make sure you pay your fees asap.

If you have applied for the School Card Grant, please await your outcome before making any payment to the school for fees, all excursions/sporting events must be paid via EdSmart at time of giving approval for your child to participate/attend. Please do this asap to receiving the email to prevent follow up from the School Administrative Staff.

#### School Card - NOW OPEN for 2023

#### <u>SA.GOV.AU - School Card scheme (www.sa.gov.au)</u>

Families who may qualify for the School Card Grant in 2023 should complete Form A – Income Audit (Combined Gross Family Income starting at \$66,412.00 for one child) or Form B – Self Employed, Hardship and Change in Circumstances.

You are now able to select the form you would like to apply your School Card Grant through and follow the prompts. You can save the form, and return to complete it at another time, by clicking on the save button. All processed applications automatically come through to the school. You will be notified by mail from School card on your outcome, if you are successful there is nothing further you need to do. If you are asked for more information, please do so in a timely manner or you risk your application being rejected.

<u>Please do not pay</u> your School Fees first if you wish to apply for the School Card Grant for 2023.

#### <u>EdSmart</u>

Some families are having both parents/caretakers pay and approve a form for the same student and occasion. Before paying please check with your partner if they have already completed the process to avoid a credit being placed on your account and follow up by a member of the Front Office. EdSmart is aware of this glitch and are working their way through it to fix it. <u>Only one payment/form submission per student & activity is required</u>.

All School excursions, Choir, camps and sporting events will now be paid direct through EdSmart when giving consent online for your child/ren to attend activities. You will no longer find any excursions etc. on Qkr to make payment, we have streamlined the process to be all done at once through EdSmart. If you have any queries, please contact the Front Office.

When completing your Edsmart form it is a 2 step process:

- 1. Pay first and <u>do not</u> exit form
- 2. Complete form, permission to be given/not given and then submit.

#### Do not pay if you are not giving permission!

If you have any issues whatsoever, please contact the Front Office so we can give further assistance.

<u>Please remember not to send cash or cheques to the Front Office.</u> We have been advised by CBA they will no longer be accepting cheques as of very soon.

#### School Uniform Orders





Uniforms are now ordered direct from Spartan School World. Information is available on the <u>school website</u>, or you can follow this <u>link</u> direct to Spartan.

<u>All returns are made direct with Spartan</u>. Please contact them on 1800 815 557 or by email at <u>onlineorders@spartanss.com.au</u>.

To assist in the prompt return of lost items to students, there is a product called Smart Tags by RagTagd which are available for purchase on the Spartan website. Simply send an SMS with the code on the tag to the number provided and you will receive a message should the item be placed in the white cupboard in the Hall/Chinese Room alerting you that the item has been located. **These tags are already attached to our polar fleece and bomber jackets – just register the item with RagTagd.** Please see below for more information.



#### **Reconciliation Week**

Reconciliation week has taken place this week. This year's theme is 'Be A Voice For Generations'.

This year is, of course, a very significant year for Reconciliation with the Referendum on a National Voice to Parliament to occur, probably in October. This presents huge opportunities for learning and engagement with both our history as a nation and how our democracy functions.

What made Reconciliation Week at NAPS particularly notable was the level of student engagement and agency. In addition to school and teacher-led activities, this year our Year 6 Student Leaders raised *their* voices. They organised the school poster drop, created buddy class activities and visited





each classroom to share the message of Reconciliation.

Some extraordinary picture books have emerged from indigenous Australia in recent years and these were at the heart of the buddy activities the Student Leaders organised.

Highlights of our indigenous library collection is also on display in the library and we encourage you to drop in and check out the great titles.

Reconciliation will continue to be a strong theme underpinning learning at NAPS and we will again run a colouring-in competition for NAIDOC Week, which is coming up at the end of this term.

We strongly encourage all NAPS families to lean into learning and conversations, especially in the lead up to the Referendum.


