Student Drop Off and Pick Up



Teachers are not on duty in the morning until 8:30am. <u>Please do not drop your children at school before 8:30am</u>. If you child walks to school please make sure they are aware that they are not to arrive at school until 8:30am. If your child arrives at school before 8:30am then they should be booked into OSHC as there are no adults on duty to supervise them. It is not safe for children to be left outside the school before 8:30am without an adult present.

At the end of the day teachers are only on duty until 3:20pm. Please ensure you have collected your child by this time. If you cannot collect your child by 3:20pm you will need to book them into OSHC. Students who are regularly not picked up by 3:20pm will be taken to OSHC and you will be charged for the After School Care. If you are running late, please call the office on 8267 1644 to advise.

Phonics Testing

All our Year 1 students recently completed our phonics screening test. They have obviously been working very hard with our Read Write Inc. (RWI) program and consequently the results are pleasing. Well done to all the Year 1 students – we are very proud of your progress.


Staffing

Parking

Most of the parking out the front of the school on Tynte Street is a "No Parking" zone from 8:15am to 9:15am, and 2:45pm to 3:45pm. We realise that the area can become congested but we need parents to please follow the rules and not double park, to ensure the safety of our students as well as the broader community. Please use the crossing when crossing the road. Please be aware that parking inspectors do occasionally patrol the area.



No Parking

You must not park your vehicle in an area where a 'No Parking' sign applies, unless:

- you are dropping off or picking up passengers or goods
- you do not leave the vehicle unattended that is, move more than three metres away and
- you complete the dropping off or picking up as soon as possible in any case, within two minutes.

World Families Australia, Minjur Home Project

As some of our community may be aware, NAPS sponsors children within the Minjur Home Project, in India. The sponsorship started as a Student Representative Council initiative back in 2021. Minjur Home is a residential home for girls from economic and socially deprived families living in and around Chennai. Boarding at the home enables them to focus on gaining an education at secondary level. They attend local schools.

Schools in Chennai re-opened 12th June 2023 and children returned to reside at Minjur Home to begin the new school year. School exam results: 21 students passed the Higher Secondary Exam and 16 students passed the 10th [Grade] Standard Exam. One student has enrolled in a Diploma Home Nursing and will continue her studies.

The goals for the new Minjur Home Project Partnership Agreement are as follows: -

- 1. Minjur Home to provide a safe haven for severely disadvantaged girls under 18 years of age, requiring protection from forced early marriage.
- 2. Minjur Home to provide food, accommodation, clothing, school supplies, socialisation and access to education for the above girls, in the belief that education plays a key role in breaking the cycle of poverty.
- 3. Equity of opportunity for all children. Women and girls are encouraged to pursue higher education. Facilitating empowerment of women and girls.
- 4. All children have access to secondary education up to 18 years of age and assisted where possible to opportunities for specialised skills training.
- 5. To promote psychological well-being for all, and access to cultural activities.
- 6. Education includes aspects of personal health, hygiene and healthy diet.
- 7. To provide health care and medical intervention where required.

I am pleased to say that we are involved in this important opportunity and that we are able to give back to a community from afar.
